Special Educational Needs and Disabilities

At Brimpton School we work hard to ensure every child has the opportunity to unlock their full potential, whatever their needs, abilities, or skills. We believe our children should participate fully in all aspects of school life. Children with Special Educational Needs make good progress at Brimpton school.

The Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Co-ordinator (SENDCO) is Mrs Zoë Baker and she is supported by Mrs Brenda Harding, the governor with responsibility for Special Educational needs.

Staff communicate regularly with the SENDCo to seek advice about children they feel may need extra support and these children will be monitored for a set period of time whilst evidence is collected to see if further help and intervention may be required and the child placed on the SEND register. Parents are also encouraged to contact the school if they feel their child is experiencing difficulties.

If a child does need to be placed on the SEND register, parents will be consulted and informed of any decisions regularly. All children on the SEND register will have a *Graduated Approach Plan (GAP)* which is a working document used by the teachers, which lists targets and outcomes along with strategies, successes, time frames and staff involved in achieving these.

From time to time, there may be the need to seek extra support and funding via an EHC plan. Parents will be fully involved in this process.
