Curriculum Information for Class 3 Summer Term 2026

Science-

Living things: Evolution and inheritance

Exploring variation and inheritance in different living things and how observations and fossil evidence have led to the theory of evolution.

Plans derived from Kapow.

Topic – Significant People throughout history.

We will be studying significant individuals, choosing from each of 3 categories. We will spend approx. 4 sessions on each of our chosen historical figures from

- An historical british figure - David Bowie
- A local figure - Catherine, The Princess of Wales
- International figure - Bill Gates

There will be a home learning project for this unit.

English -

Plans derived from The Literacy Tree - based upon Can We Save the Tiger by Martin Jenkins and Vicky White. It also touches upon the poem The Tyger by William Blake from Songs of Innocence and Experience. Children begin by exploring an argument from another group's perspective before going on to read the text. During the sequence of learning, children create persuasive posters, persuasive speeches and information index cards. There is also opportunity to write, learn and perform poetry and for children to share their speeches orally with an audience. The final outcome gives children the opportunity to research an endangered animal of their choice before writing and publishing a discussion text. There is a focus in this Writing Root on applying knowledge of grammar, punctuation and language thoughtfully for a range of different non-fiction purposes. This includes considerations related to formality.

Maths –

Ratio and proportion – Scale factors, ratio problems

Algebra - Formulae, equations

Shape – Angles, regular/irregular shapes, circles

Position and direction – coordinates, translations

Statistics – Bar charts, pie charts, line graphs

Converting units – kg/g, m/cm/m, l/ml
